- Host two Just Play festivals during the academic year

# • 2 x League Officers

- Practically deliver and facilitate league fixtures
- Coordinate fixtures and results
- Raise awareness and the profile of the league within the University community

#### • 1 x Coaching Officer

- To support the Hub to deliver FA coach education courses by coordinating and facilitating delivery
- To support students who are interested in coaching with accessing opportunities within the community

### • 1 x Referee Officer

- To support the Hub to deliver referee courses
- To support students who are interested in refereeing with accessing opportunities within the community

## • 1 x Disability Officer

- To support the Hub to deliver FA Coaching Disabled footballers course.
- To support the Hub to Deliver disability football provision.
- Co-ordinate and facilitate collaborative events to further promote disability football.

The Just Play sessions are delivered on a Monday and Tuesday evening and the league is delivered on a Thursday evening and Sunday morning.

All 7 officers are expected to attend monthly progress meetings.
